If they are not cross-listed, BLS, WGS, SUS are Social Science courses. REL is a Humanities. URB and HLT can be used for either, but not both, Social Sciences or Humanities. **FLL, POR, WGS, BLS courses that are cross-listed with ENL literature, count as a literature.
